First 12 months treatment check list

6 weeks of age	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Worm treatment due (worm every 2 weeks until 12 weeks of age). - Begin vaccination series now. Vaccination boosters are required 3-4 weeks apart with the last vaccination booster given over 14 weeks of age. - Consider pet insurance, there is usually a 'stand down' period of 21 days 	
8 weeks	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Worm treatment due - Start flea treatment. Be sure to allow for growth each month. Refer to flea treatment chart within this pack for different flea treatment options. 	
10 weeks	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Vaccination booster. - Microchip placement recommended. - Worm treatment due 	
12 weeks	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Worm treatment due - Flea treatment due 	
14 weeks old	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Last kitten vaccination booster. 	
4 months old	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Worm monthly from 3 – 6 months of age - Monthly flea treatment for the duration of the cats life 	
5 months old	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Consider desexing at this age - Worming required 	
6 months old	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Book in for desexing if not done already - Worm treatment required. Give worm treatment 3 monthly for the rest of your cat's life (or 2 times per year if Revolution or Advocate is used monthly). 	
7-12 months	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Food should be rationed to avoid excess body fat as the kitten growth rate slows 	
12 months +	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Stop kitten food now. Change to a good quality adult cat food - Annual vaccine is due soon. We will send you a reminder if we gave your kitten vaccinations.
